SAFETY RULES FOR THE OCTOBER 21, 2022 EVENT

We are excited and hopeful that our Fall Event will move forward. It has been a frustrating time trying to organize and hold an event this past two years. The Covid concern and its variants still remain a major concern, and the health of our participants is a top priority. We will be instituting the following rules and Conditions that need to be **Strictly Enforced**. We have relaxed some of the previous rules as conditions have changed.

All participants, including advisers, must take an **INSTANT TEST** before entering the track. **The test kits are to be provided by the team or school system**. Should a student test positive the entire team will not be allowed to enter the track. It is advisable that you test your students the day before the competition especially if you are traveling a long distance to participate.

Each team will be restricted to fifteen members plus the adviser. We would like to have additional students involved but health and safety concerns are our top priority.

YOUR TEAM WILL NOT BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IF YOU ARE MISSING ANY OF THE REGISTORTATION INFORMATION! In the registration packet, last section, you will notice specific items that need to be sent in with your registration information, please follow the procedure. WE WILL NOT BE TAKING ANY MISSING FORMS THE DAY OF THE COMPETITION, SUCH AS CHECKS, LIABILITY RELEASE FORMS, MEDICAL INFORMATION, ELECTRATHON MEMBERSHIP CARD, ETC.

REGISTRATION:

Please do not rush the registration table!!! Each team will receive a number and be called to the registration table. **Teams that send in an incomplete registration packet will not be eligible to participate**. As your number is called proceed to the registration table with your batteries, ballast, and two drivers.

Once you complete the registration process and flag test, have the batteries weighed and place them in the holding area. The two drivers, with their ballast are to proceed to the weigh-in area. Once the drivers complete the weigh-in process the car and drivers are ready for the vehicle inspection

INSPECTION:

Your vehicle is to pass all inspection stations. Upon passing the inspection you will be given a sticker to place on your vehicle. Should you have trouble passing the inspection, please don't be upset with inspectors, they didn't build the vehicle. They are only checking to be certain that the vehicle is safe.

PIT STOP:

We will be placing markers in the pit area for cars entering the pit. You are to go to the farthest open bay when making a stop. The pit attendant will tell you when it is safe to exit.

DRIVER CHANGE:

Once again, during the driver change, **ONLY THE NEW DRIVER AND TWO PIT CREW MEMBERS ARE ALLOWED IN THE PIT** while the first driver and ballast gets weighed.

What to Expect when arriving at Lime Rock Park

- 1. All students and advisors are to sign-in at the main gate, and HAND IN THE INSURANCE LIABILITY RELEASE FORMS.
- 2. Find a spot behind the yellow tape for your team. Once you have unloaded and get situated wait for the registration table to call your team.
- **3.** When proceeding to the registration table, please bring the following items:
 - Two drivers per vehicle, and adviser
 - Ballast for each driver
 - Competition batteries
 - Arm bands

4. The CCSU Inspection team will check ballast, administer driver's test, weigh-in driver, place batteries in the holding area, and inspect your vehicle. Once inspected, they will place a sticker on your vehicle and your team will be allowed to use the track for time trials.

* Reminder to all new and returning teams! CCSU will administer a drivers test on the flag system. Each driver must pass the test receiving a minimum of six (6) correct answers out of seven (7).

Registration Form

In an effort to defray the cost of insurance and materials needed to host such an event, it was decided that an entry fee be instituted.

For the 2022-2023 season, the Entry fee will be \$75.00 per vehicle.

Rules and Regulations

- Students are not to leave the track area
- Students and staff are not permitted on the ends of the course or the far side of the track. All students, staff and advisors are to stay behind the yellow tape.
- Each team must have at least one adult responsible for each 10 students.
- The inspection team will not tolerate any type of harassment from the team or its leaders. If this happens you will be asked to leave. Inspectors will make ever effort to see that your team participates. Safety is their first priority if something is not to regulation, remember that they did not construct the vehicle.
- Each team is required to have at least 1 volunteer (if needed) to assist the race officials.
- Teams are required to **pick up after themselves**. Waste receptacles will be placed near the track.
- All the persons associated with an Electrathon event are expected to conduct themselves in a cordial manner. Confrontations or arguments will not be tolerated and participants are subject to disqualification.
- Once a decision has been rendered concerning a specific issue and your team disagrees, follow the grievance procedure. Don't go to another official and try to reverse the decision.
- Should your team vehicle experience trouble on the track, the driver is to pull off the track to a designated work area. No competition car will be allowed back to the team area.
- The pit crew is not to cross the track!! The pit crew(Maximum 3 members) may walk along the outside grass section, under the yellow flag, to make repairs. Should the vehicle experience trouble on the inside of the track the pit crew must wait for the yellow flag and for the race steward to allow them to cross the track. The pit crew is to have a maximum of three people.

Lime Rock Park has been generous and has allowed CT Electrathon the use of their facility; we respect and honor their rules.

House Keeping

- All teams participating in the spring competition must be registered with Electrathon America and hold a valid membership card. This card must be presented for each vehicle at the time of registration.
- Once your team enters the race area, NO STUDENTS will be allowed to leave.
- You must have at least one adult responsible for 10 students.
- Should you have a dispute with officials, check the grievance procedure.
- Once you have your vehicle inspected, the time trial will be open to test your vehicle.
- There is no electricity available at the track. Bring extra batteries.
- We anticipate teams from other states to participate. We can learn a lot by making these teams feel welcome.

Updates

::Limiting the Number of Vehicles::

The Electrathon program is gaining in popularity and we are forced to limit the number of vehicles each participating school may enter, therefore each school may enter a MAXIMUM of THREE VEHICLES. We must operate within the time allotted us on the track.

::Selection of Vehicle Positions::

All cars must be pre-registered and are to be at the track ready to compete for the first heat. Selection of cars' positions in each heat will be completed by a lottery at 9a.m. Cars from different classes will run in the same heat with each car having a class designation placed on the car. A maximum of two vehicles from any school will compete in the same heat.

::Classes::

NOVICE CLASS- This class will be opened to first time or new teams that have just completed their first vehicle. They will remain in this class for the full season, but should they complete more than 50 laps in the spring competition they will be moved into the Classic Class.

CLASSIC CLASS- This class is designed for teams that have prior experience in Electrathon Competition. The Vehicle is limited to hand built metal cars and kit cars.

COMPOSITE CLASS- Cars that are constructed entirely of Composite material (no frame) will compete in this class. Should the composite vehicle be your first attempt at the Electrathon series your team will participate in this class.

TROPHIES WILL ONLY BE GIVEN IN CLASSES WITH SIX OR MORE VEHICLES!!!

::Best In Show::

The Best in Show award will only be given at the SPRING event. This award is open to new vehicles, from any High school, in any state, so long as they meet judging criteria.

Again, your representative CANNOT VOTE FOR YOUR OWN SCHOOL'S VEHICLE.

Part of the award includes the 50 copies of the Information Fact Sheet as well as the voting Ballot. The fact sheet is attached, please feel free to use our template, or create your own with similar information.

::Process::

New vehicles meeting the above criteria will be requested to be moved into the PIT area during the lunch break. At 12:00 we are asking for one representative from each school to come forward to receive a voting form, view each vehicle and then cast a vote for the one they feel should receive the "Best In Show"

award.

Remember - you cannot vote for your own school.

Only one representative from each school shall be provided the opportunity to vote. In the case of a tie - A representative from CCSU will be requested to view the two tied vehicles and select the one to receive the honor of Best In Show.

Note - Should there only be one vehicle eligible for the Best In Show - no award will be given.

::Driver Exit Time::

When changing drivers during the competition, the first driver must pull into the pit area, exit the vehicle with ALL THE BALLAST and get weighed. The second driver is to secure THEIR Ballast and enter the vehicle. Should the two drivers be the same weight, the first driver must remove the entire ballast, get weighed while the second driver installs THEIR NEW BALLAST

NOTE: Each driver is to their own ballast. Should a team have only one driver, they must remove ballast, get weighed, reinstall ballast before entering the vehicle. The team vehicle will be penalized one lap.

::Batteries::

We will remain with the 67lb rule for the 2021-2022 season.

Any commercially produced agm/gel cell battery combination will be acceptable up to 67 lbs.

NO HEATING OR CHARGING of batteries will be allowed at the track.

Batteries will be subject to a temperature inspection.

The competition batteries are to be placed in a holding area with the batteries from other teams. Ten minutes before your scheduled heat your team may remove the batteries from the holding area.

::Slow Vehicles::

While we encourage each team to do their individual best, slow vehicles have become a safety problem. Driving a vehicle at a slow speed when the batteries are low harms the battery life, and causes a potentially dangerous situation on the track. It has been decided that when a vehicle takes 60 seconds or longer to complete a lap on the course, it will be required to pit and will not be allowed back onto the track.

::Passing::

Slow cars are to stay to the INSIDE of the track. The Race Steward will explain the proper passing procedure at the drivers meeting. Should you have any questions, this will be the time to ask. If your drivers fail to follow the rules, they will be black flagged immediately. YOUR WARNING IS THE EXPLAINATION AT THE DRIVERS MEETING. We cannot sacrifice safety on the track. Any additional questions concerning the passing/no passing areas can be discussed with the race steward.

:: Unsafe Passing ::

When passing another vehicle, you must pass in the DESIGNATED AREA ONLY. Remember that the slow cars will be flagged to the inside of the track.

:: End of Competition Inspection ::

At the end of each heat, each driver is to pull into the pit area and remain in the vehicle until the vehicle is inspected or you are told to take the vehicle to your team's area. We will be mixing classes together so several vehicles may need to be inspected at the end of each heat. TEAM MEMBERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ASSIST THE DRIVER. The Adviser will be the only person to assist the driver.

*Below is the new Liability release and medical authorization form (3 pages). Please complete the form for EACH driver, and mail in 2 copies of each completed form.

- I agree to assume all costs related to any medical treatment; I authorize my insurance company to pay benefits for the costs of such treatment; I also authorize the disclosure of medical information to my insurance for the purpose of any claim.
- I understand each parent must provide his/her own medical insurance; I also understand that I am responsible for any medical or other charges related to participation in the CT ELECTRATHON CHALLENGE.
- I give my consent for medical treatment, and permission to event personnel to supervise or perform on-site first aid to minor injuries and to a licensed physician to hospitalize and secure proper treatment (including injections, anesthesia, surgery, or other reasonable and necessary procedures) for the participant (If you wish to limit medical treatment, draw a line through it or add your comment and initial the changes);

To facilitate a medical situation, please complete the attached medical card.
